## **Phin'tastic Accomplishments**

Director of Jazz Studies **Professor John Ricci** led a performance tour with the JU jazz faculty to four preeminent arts high schools in Flagler and Broward County Florida early in 2022.

Biology Professor **Dr. Dan McCarthy** and his students waded through the tall grassy banks and into the St. Johns River just outside the Marine Science Research Institute to make shelters. The project, part of a cross-listed graduate and undergraduate class on reef ecology and management, is designed to see what organisms in the river are attracted to the shelters and what type of shelter they prefer.

Dolphin Pitch was first introduced to Jacksonville University in 2019. It combines the formats of reality television shows "The Voice" and "Shark Tank" to create a new hands-on experience for business students to present their business plans to a panel of esteemed judges.

The University Singers, directed by **Dr. Julian Bryson**, presented a featured concert on the St. John's Episcopal Cathedral concert series, and provided service music for The Order of Malta Mass of Anointing. Both events were well-attended, and the students represented Jacksonville University with excellence.

JU hosted the sixth Jacksonville University Chamber Music Intensive. The seven-day summer camp was available to current 8<sup>th</sup> grade students through class of 2022 high school seniors who play piano and string instruments. Activities included chamber music rehearsals, coachings, and more. Distinguished faculty, co-directors **Dr. Shannon Lockwood**, and **Dr. Marguerite Richardson**, performed recitals and provided instruction. As well as, **Dr. Scott Watkins**, and adjunct **Professor Todd Lockwood**. Professors **Shelley Grant**, **Dr. Ashley Johnson**, and **Dr. Ray Oldakowski** combined their GIS and Writing in the Social Sciences courses to offer students an opportunity to research, analyze, and present a current issue through the use of maps. Student-led, and made possible through I-DID grant funding and support from Gemini Engineering, Jacksonville University hosted its first regional GIS conference this past April.

**Dr. Stephanie James**, Associate Professor of Educational Leadership, launched a new concentration of the Master of Science in Leadership and Learning degree. The Student Affairs in Higher Education concentration is designed to do just that: prepare students to advance and take on leadership roles in postsecondary education.

Jacksonville University programs in business and nursing have again landed on three prestigious lists from the Princeton Review and CEO Magazine, ranking them amongst the best programs of their kind.
